

Bibliography Style Guide

Secondary Sources

When citing a **secondary source** (usually a book) in a footnote or endnote, use this format:

1. Firstname Lastname, *Title of Book* (Place of publication: Publisher, Year of publication), page number.

Example:

1. William Faulkner, *Absalom, Absalom!* (New York: Vintage Books, 1990), 271.

When citing a **secondary source** (usually a book) in your bibliography, use this format:

Lastname, Firstname. *Title of Book*. Place of publication: Publisher, Year of publication.

Example:

Faulkner, William. *Absalom, Absalom!*. New York: Vintage Books, 1990.

Consult the Purdue Online Writing Lab website for complex entries such as no known author, multiple author, or editors.

BHS Maps

When citing a **map** from BHS collection in a footnote, caption, or bibliography, use this format:

Title, Creator (if known), Date; Call Number; Brooklyn Historical Society.

Example:

Peremptory sale of 203 lots of ground on 6th Avenue. Miller & Co., 1834; B P-[1834]d.FI; Brooklyn Historical Society.

BHS Artwork

When citing a **work of art** from the BHS collection (including photographs, paintings, or works on paper) in a footnote, caption, or bibliography, use this format:

Title, date, call number; Collection, collection call number; Brooklyn Historical Society.

Example:

The Washington St. Front, 1876, v1972.1.922; Early Brooklyn and Long Island photograph collection, ARC.201; Brooklyn Historical Society.

Furman Journals

When citing a specific passage from **Furman's journals** in a footnote or endnote or bibliography, use this format:

Identification of item (Title of entry), date (if known), volume, page numbers; Gabriel Furman papers, ARC.190, box number, folder number; Brooklyn Historical Society.

Example:

American Superstitions, 1837, volume 8, 226-228; Gabriel Furman papers, ARC.190, box 3, folder 1; Brooklyn Historical Society.
